2009-10 Dislocated Worker Verification Form

Purpose of this form: As of the date you filed your FAFSA, you indicated “yes” to the status of “dislocated worker” on question #85 (parent) or #103 (independent student as defined by the FAFSA, questions 48 through 60). This form will be used to verify that answer.

A person may be considered a dislocated worker if he or she is:

- *receiving unemployment benefits due to being laid off or losing a job and is unlikely to return to a previous occupation; has been laid off or received a lay-off notice from a job;*
- *was self-employed but is now unemployed due to economic conditions or natural disaster;*
- *or is a displaced homemaker. A displaced homemaker is generally a person who previously provided unpaid services to the family (e.g., a stay-at-home mom or dad), is no longer supported by the husband or wife, is unemployed or underemployed and is having trouble finding or upgrading employment.*

As of the date you filed your FAFSA, is either of your parents (or you) a dislocated worker? (Q85) If a person quits work, generally he or she is not considered a dislocated worker even if, for example, the person is receiving unemployment benefits. If you answer “yes,” additional documentation to support your unemployment status may be required.
